




Gallup: Strong Mentorship and Supportive Professors Set Furman Apart


Strong individualized relationships between students and faculty continue to set Furman ahead of other universities.








Furman continues to improve on its career resource communication to students, especially among upperclassmen

Overview of the Pathways Program®


Advisors meet with 15 students once per week for 50 minutes during their first two years and cover common curriculum developed by on-campus experts.

- Students earn 1 credit each semester for the letter graded course (for a total of 4 credit hours over 2 years).
- Advisors receive a stipend or count the course within load.
- Peer Mentors receive a stipend for co-facilitating in the first year of the program.
